#### WHAT IS GOD DOING IN YOUR LIFE?

"But as for you, you thought evil against me; but God meant it for good, to bring to pass, as it is this day, to save many people alive." (Genesis 50:20)

One of the valuable lessons we may learn from the story of the life of Joseph is that of waiting on God.

Sometimes these results may also take us through the frightening valley of personal reflection as God changes us from the inside out. He often does this to prepare us for greater service.

What good thing is God doing in your life right now? Maybe the answer to the question is clear. Chances are, though, it is still a mystery! In time you will understand His plan and you, and you will be thankful that you continued to love the Lord and trust him with your future.

# Fellowship: Is It Worth It?

Is it worth working in the heat for \$10, \$100, or \$1000? Christians, we are called to consider an even greater value: fellowship with God and His people.

1 John 1:3 teaches that we have "fellowship with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ." But what does this truly mean to us? Is there any value there?

Consider the early Christians who first received John's letter. They faced persecution and hardship for their faith, yet they remained steadfast in their communion with God and each other. Remember how this fellowship was made possible. Sin had separated us from God. We were "alienated from the life of God" (Eph 2:12). But through Christ's sacrifice, we now have "boldness and access with confidence to God" (Eph 3:12). This precious gift came at an immeasurable cost – the blood of God's own Son (Acts 20:28). Surely, such a priceless gift deserves our wholehearted engagement.

Now, examine your life. Is fellowship with God worth the work? Do you glorify God with our attitudes, striving to have the mind of Christ (Philippians 2:5)? Do you prioritize gathering with fellow believers (Hebrews 10:25)? Does your church count on you?

God calls us to be partners with Him and His church (Phil 1:5). This partnership isn't just about attending services – it's about fully engaging in the life of the church community. When we invest our time, talents, and resources in our local church, we are not just supporting an organization; we are nurturing our fellowship with God and His people. When we fully participate in church life, we experience the richness of true fellowship that God intends for us. We become part of something greater than ourselves – a living, breathing community of faith that reflects God's love to the world.

So, is it worth it? Yes! The rewards of true fellowship – both now and in eternity – far outweigh any temporary discomfort or sacrifice. This week, challenge yourself to deepen your engagement with your local church. Attend that midweek service, volunteer for that outreach event, or reach out to support a fellow believer. As you do, you'll discover the immeasurable worth of genuine fellowship with God and His people.

### LET'S TAKE A MINUTE:

## LORD, HEAR OUR PRAYER

"The LORD has heard my supplication; the Lord will receive my prayer." (Ps. 6:9)

Several years ago, I had occasion to attend the funeral of a Catholic friend in Fort Worth. While leading the assembled congregation in prayer, the leader said, "Lord, in your mercy," and the audience would respond by citing, "Hear our prayer!"

After repeating the phrase in a lengthy prayer which repeated the phrases, a young boy behind us finally shouted out, "Hear our prayer!" The little fellow expressed what a lot of us were feeling that afternoon.

As Christians, we believe that God hears us when we pray, not because we deserve to be heard but because God opened the way to talk directly to our Heavenly Father. We may often make our requests quietly, but there are times when we cannot help but cry out to Him in anguish and pain!

In the sixth Psalm, we can almost hear David's sobs as he pleaded with God for mercy, help and healing. Even though David faced difficult people and overwhelming circumstances, he affirmed his faith in God: "The LORD has heard the voice of my weeping. The LORD has heard my supplication. The Lord will receive my prayer," (vs. 8-9)

Today, in the mysterious blend of confidence and crying out, we can bring anything, and everything, to our loving God, saying, "Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer."
