The title of this article comes from a phrase attributed to the Chicago Daily News reporter Charlie Owens in reference to baseball player shoeless Joe Jackson's admission that he cheated in the 1919 World Series Major League Baseball game. This was a game fixing scandal in which eight members of the Chicago White Sox were accused of cheating and losing, on purpose, the 1919 World Series against the Cincinnati Reds. Eight players reportedly received money from a gambling syndicate for throwing the game! All eight players were banned from professional baseball, including Shoeless Joe Jackson.

The Scriptures abound with exhortations in promotion of honesty and integrity! For example:

- a. OFFENCES: "Woe unto the world because of offences! For it must needs be that offences will come, but woe to that man by whom the of fence comes." (Matt. 18:7)
