LET'S TAKE A MINUTE:

NO EXPLANATION REQUIRED

"I have uttered what I did not understand, things to wonderful for me, which I did not know." (Job 42:3)

A college classmate of mine who believed God had led him to take a daring step of faith, said, "If God doesn't give me success in this matter, He will have a lot of explaining to do!"

Thoroughly humbled, Job admitted, "I have uttered what I did not understand; things which I did not know."

LET'S TAKE A MINUTE:

I'M IN IT TO WIN IT!

"But thanks be to God which gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." (1 Cor. 9:24)

"I'm in it to win it" is a phrase used to win a victory in a contest, or competition of any kind – from sports to politics.

A computer study of five thousand racehorses has revealed a way to predict whether a young horse can develop into a good runner. A professor at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology used computers and highspeed cameras to find out how well a good horse can run. He discovered that the legs of a fast horse operate much like the spokes of a wheel. Each leg touches down only as the leg pushes off before it pushes off. The effect is peak efficiency of effort and speed.

In the Old Testament Isaiah talked about running well during life. He said that the person who runs the best is the one who learns to "Wait on the Lord!" (Isaiah 40:31). He does not waste energy trying to do things on his own. He looks to the Lord for his strength and hope.

In the New Testament, the Christian life is like a race. The apostle Paul indicated that those who run well are characterized by self-control and self-discipline. (1st Cor. 9:24-27). The author of Hebrews said, "Let us lay aside every weight and the sin which so easily ensnares us and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us." (Heb.12:1) Do you want to earn an impressionable crown? Then wait on the Lord with determination and patience!

The Scriptures encourage the Christian to make every effort to gains success in winning the victory through the Lord Jesus Christ. John wrote, "This is the victory that overcomes the world, even our faith. (I Jn. 5:4)

In I Cor. 9:24, Paul declared: "Know ye not that they who run the race run all, but one receives the prize? So run that ye may obtain."

These Scriptures are instructing the Christian not to give up! Do not quit! Complete your spiritual race! Do not grow weary in well doing!
