A CLEAN BLACKBOARD

"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." (I John 1:9)

Some can remember when our elementary classrooms featured blackboards on the walls. Do you remember when your teacher had you come up to erase the chalk from the boards in your room? You felt so special that she would trust, and call upon you, to perform such an important task! When you wiped down the entire board, it was as if nothing had been written on it.

This is much like the promise of God that when we repent and ask His forgiveness, He will both forgive and forget our transgressions. "Their sins and iniquities will I remember no more." (Jer. 31:34; Heb. 8:12)

Notice what He promises – both forgiveness and forgetting! It's like God, upon our confession of sins and asking forgiveness, will "wipe the board clean" of our transgressions, and just as Jesus said to the woman caught in adultery, we are to "...go and sin no more." (John 8:11)

Is your 'spiritual blackboard' cluttered with a record of sins in your life? Well then, here is your 'assignment' - erase them all by confessing and seeking forgiveness from a savior who is "rich in mercy, for His great love wherewith He has loved us!" (Eph. 2:4) Only then will the slate be wiped clean. God has promised He will do that for us.

Remember how you loved the praise of your teacher for having done such a good job of erasing the blackboard? Imagine your reward for having repented and seeking God's forgiveness and praise!
