Draw Near To God Carefully

"But for me, it is good to be near God; I have made the Lord GOD my refuge, that I may tell of all your works" (Ps 73:28).

The Psalmist said, "It is good to be near God," but God's presence can also be a scary reality. God's greatness is so overwhelming that even the glory surrounding him is described as "unapproachable light" (1 Tim 6:16). God warned, "Man shall not see me and live" (Exod 33:20). In the OT people expected to die when they had been in God's presence (Gen 32:30; Judg 6:22–23; 13:22; Isa 6:5). Divine holiness forms an inherent separation between God and his creatures. God's holiness is also dangerous. To trespass God's holiness results in desecration, which must be punished (Lev 7:19–21; 22:2). Numbers 18:32 warns, "You shall not profane the holy things of the people of Israel, lest you die." Yet, the Scriptures encourage us to "come boldly before the throne of grace" (Heb 4:16). How is this possible? How can we find refuge rather than fear in the presence of our holy God?

The astounding truth of the gospel is that the holy God chose to draw near to us. In Christ, "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14), and "in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily" (Col 2:9). Where Christ goes, his holiness overcomes our unholiness. The blind see, the crippled walk, and sinners are saved. God's holiness, once a source of fear, becomes the reason for Christian joy as we are covered in God's grace. Remember this when you think of baptism. We are "baptized into Christ" (Rom 6:3) and we are "blessed with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus" (Eph 1:3). The holy God whose presence terrified the great heroes of the OT is the same God who unites us to himself.

The marvel of the gospel is that Christians are safe in the holy presence of God. God makes peace between us and himself (Rom 5:1) and even in his holy presence, there is no condemnation (Rom 8:1). The God who seemed distant and unapproachable is the same God who invites you to take refuge in him, to draw near, and to find peace in his holy presence. Our relationship with God and nearness to God should be valued above everything in this life (Deut 6:5; Matt 10:37). There will be many opportunities to be distracted from God and to be led away from God. Say no to them (1 Jn 2:15). The guilt of past sin may try to hold you back, but Christ can bring you home (Is 43:25). It is good for you to be near God, to make the Lord GOD your refuge, and to tell of all his works (Ps 73:28).

We go back to the first century and discover Paul traveling from town to town preaching the gospel and facing opposition and other difficult situations. (2 Cor. 4-8; 11:23-33) Then, after time, he found help and hope by turning to the Lord.

How about you? How do you respond when things go wrong? Do you fall apart? If so, do you seek God's help in prayer? Are you "Casting all your cares upon Him, because He cares for you?" (I Pet. 5:7) Do you pray for a positive attitude in handling life's problems?

When things go wrong, ask God for strength and wisdom and He will grant them to you!
