## "BUT HIS HEART WAS NOT IN IT"

"This people honor me with their lips, but their heart is far from me." (Mt. 16:8)

To my knowledge, Amaziah, the eighth king of Judah, is the only man in the Scriptures of whom it was said "He did that which was right in the eyes of the LORD, but not with a perfect heart." Some translations read "...but his heart was not in it."

To say that one's heart is not in something is the same as declaring that his/her interest and enthusiasm are not a part of that in which they are engaged. For example, what about our prayers? Do we make the words, the requests we make of God, and especially our declarations of praise and thanksgiving to Him from the depths of our heart? In other words, do we pray fervently because our hearts are in it? What about worship? Do we participate with a devoted and sincere heart? Do we sing praise to God and join in each prayer, making it our own? Do we listen to each point of the sermon as Donnie DeBord pours out his heart to teach, instruct and motivate us to live faithfully in obedience to God?

Paul admonished his brethren to be "...fervent in spirit; serving the Lord." (Rom. 12:11b) Jesus said, "You shall love the LORD thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment." (Mk. 12:30) Obviously, demonstrating a half-hearted commitment to God is unacceptable to our Heavenly Father!

Take time to dwell upon this concept and remember to "keep thy heart with all diligence for out of it are the issues of life." (Prov. 4:23) The fact here stated is that the whole moral conduct of human life, and its every action, attitude and purpose are determined by what one thinks and believes

From a young man's heart who is frustrated with his mother's request that he take out the trash, to the heart of a New York stockbroker who sometimes has to make financial decisions against his better judgment, we have all had to make decisions when our heart was not in it!

But when it comes to living for the Lord, our heart MUST be in it! God said to Israel after they had profaned His name, "And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you." (Ezek. 36:26) Jesus said to one of the scribes in Mark Mt. 22:37, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, with all thy soul, and with all thy mind." What does the Bible mean by, "with all thy heart?" The answer is simple: we are to use our time, talents, soul, mind and strength and resources to keep His commandments. It means to love and obey Him with our whole life. . .living each day in subjection to Him!
