I Wish We Had Someone Who..

“Make Disciples” (Matthew 28:19-20)

I wish we had more preachers. I wish we had more Bible teachers. I wish we had more song leaders. I wish we had more leaders. I wish our servants' skills were more polished. What can we do?

HAVE YOU “BEEN WITH JESUS?”

“And when they saw the boldness of Peter and John. . .they took knowledge of them that they had been with Jesus.” (John 4:13)

In the MAGNOLIA MESSENGER ((Fall, 2022, Vol. 44, No. 3), Kathy Brummett of the Batesville congregation in Panola County, has an article she entitled, “WAR ROOM,” in which she talked about her practice of beginning each day in Bible study and prayer.

Kathy wrote: “My quiet time each morning was something I carefully guarded. First, I found a spot in a closet in an upstairs bedroom that was unused and quiet. I moved the few things in the closet to a new location and moved in a small bookcase and a chair. I am an early riser, so I usually made my way to my “war room” with a cup of coffee anytime from 4 a.m. – 5 a.m. Most times, I could manage to get a couple of hours in my new quiet spot.”

“The length of time I have for “quiet times” will change with different seasons of life. The amount of time is not the most important thing. It’s about creating the habit of spending time-with Jesus that’s important! It doesn’t have to be at 4 a.m. I just happen to be an early riser.”

“I usually have one or two daily devotional books with short articles to jump start the day. I am always working my way through the Bible with study guides. . .or a topical study that goes a little more in depth.”

“One morning, I was working through the book of Acts. I was in chapter four and reading about Peter and John being hauled in because they had annoyed the priests, the captain of the guard and the Sadducees. When I got to verse 13 of Acts 4, I felt like I had been sucker-punched! “Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were uneducated, common men, they were astonished, AND THEN they recognized that they had BEEN WITH JESUS!”

“I was getting up every morning and having an hour and a half, to two hours, alone with Jesus, but could anybody tell that about me through the rest of the day? Could my husband tell that I had ‘been with Jesus?’ Could the checker at the grocery store tell that I had ‘been with Jesus’? Could anyone I had encountered throughout the day tell that I had ‘been with Jesus?’ My prayer each morning, as I end my “quiet time,” has become: “Lord, please let the people I meet each day be able to tell that I began my day with You!”

How can we attract people to Jesus if being with Him hasn’t changed us?. ..Is my life reflecting a life that has been changed by being in the presence of Jesus? May we all be determined to be different because “we have been with Jesus!”
